- 4. Assessment: Create and select an array of appropriate assessments to guide instruction, measure student learning, and evaluate the effectiveness of the health and physical education program.
- 5. Professionalism: Demonstrate professionalism by effectively using verbal and non-verbal communication, collaborating with others in a professional manner, utilizing the reflective cycle to implement change in teacher performance and student learning, demonstrating behaviors that are consistent with the professional ethics of highly qualified teachers, and participating in activities that lead to professional growth and development.
